Empowering Survivors of Domestic Violence

We learned about the Cycle of Abuse, why women stay wi

Red flags include:

- Repeated injuries, clumsy
- Bruises on arms or hidden areas
- Reason does not match injury
- Red marks or bruises on neck
- Withdrawal from family and friends
- Blames self, self doubt
- Changes plans at the last minute
- Refers to partner as jealous, possessive
- Checks with partner at all times constant calls or texts
- Asks partner's permission before agreeing to anything
- Changes in personality (extremely meek, apologetic, apprehensive, fearful
- Social media monitored, partner always knows where person is
- Constant nit-picking, name calling, criticism
- Property damage, revenge injury to children, pets
- Doesn't have money or know finances
- Increased drinking substance abuse (self medicating or forced)

Offer support, listen, help identify resources. The abused partner will need to make the decision to leave the abusive relationship when they feel it's safe.

The Magic of Mentoring

- Mentors see something in you that you may not see in yourself.
- Good mentors have experience not necessarily tied to level of education.
- Mentorship doesn't have to be from older to younger person.
- A mentor conveys wisdom based on expertise.
- Mentoring os friendship oriented.
- Mentors: train, motivate, advise, direct, coach, support, goal set, succeed.


ADVOCACY: POLITICAL YES, NON-PARTISAN, YES



On July 20th, 2023 three of Amelia's grand-nephews will visit the Amelia Earhart Birthplace Museum to enjoy a dinner. Only seven guests will have the opportunity to dine with the family members in the Formal Dining Room of the house. This is a once in a lifetime event.

There are two events of which the night will comprise. At **5:30 pm**, there will be a cocktail hour with the three grand-nephews and twenty guests. Tickets for the cocktail hour are \$100 per person, with drink tickets included. Following the cocktail hour will be the formal dinner at **7 pm**. The dinner will include the grand-nephews and seven guests. Dinner tickets are \$5000 per person or \$9500 for a couple. Dinner will be catered by Pete's Steakhouse.

Proceeds of the event will go towards the preservation and renovation of the house. Also, the guests will be named on our new donor board.

Amelia Earhart herself had no biological children, but her younger sister Muriel did. Muriel had two children with her husband Albert Morrissey, and three of her grandchildren will be in attendance at this dinner. Brothers Bram and Caleb Kleppner, and their cousin Jim Morrissey will regale guests with tales of their great-aunt Amelia that they heard while growing up. As well, they will share memories of their other family members that lived alongside Amelia, including their grandmother Muriel.

Staff of the Amelia Earhart Birthplace Museum will also be in attendance. Executive Director Heather Roesch is "beyond excited to spend the evening with Amelia's family at their familial home. I can't wait to hear the stories of their lives and of Amelia and Muriel."
