Dorothy I. Fennell, Microbiologist

Club President, Laura Burton, visited club member, Cheryl Bielema, to enjoy the Spoon River Valley Scenic Drive in the Canton, Illinois area. One of the places they toured was the Canton Area Heritage Center that Cheryl helped found in 2015. During Women's History Month (March, 2023), the museum's programs committee researched and set up an exhibit featuring outstanding women. The women were born and raised or worked professionally in this rural area of Illinois. Many people have remarked, "I didn't know about these talented women!"

Laura asked Cheryl to share several of the Women-of-Note biographies with Zonta sisters. The first is a microbiologist Dorothy Fennell who graduated from Canton High School in 1934 and worked at the USDA Research Center, located in Peoria.



Dorothy Fennell was born on October 23, 1916, in Middle Grove, Illinois. She moved to Canton at age 3 and continued school there. Fennell is credited with the discovery of *Penicillium chrysogenum*, the parent organism that produces the antibiotic Penicillin G.

In 1938 she graduated from the University of Illinois with a B.A. in bacteriology. She worked as a science teacher in Lewistown, Illinois, 1938-1941. In 1942 she began working at Northern Regional Research Center in Peoria on the Penicillin team where she eventually became its team leader and achieved the title of Microbiologist. The antibiotic Penicillum G made possible the first mass immunization that has saved millions of people worldwide.

Fennel won the USDA Superior Service Award in 1950 and the Federal Women's Award in 1976 (one of only six women who have received this). Four micro-organisms have been named after her and she authored two scientific books and authored and co-authored 60 scientific papers.

Dorothy Fennell died July 20, 1977, of leukemia and is buried in Greenwood Cemetery in Canton. She was honored as one of Canton's outstanding citizens at the museum's Cemetery Walk in 2023.






SANTA'S HELPERS SERVICE PROJECT

Dr. Marilyn Waring is internationally known for her ground-breaking work in political economy, development assistance and human rights, and her



She has been a member of the Board of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand, the Councils of Creative New Zealand and Massey University, the QEII National Trust and the Institute of Judicial Studies, and most recently, the WHO Council on The Economics of Health for All.

In 2020, Marilyn became a Dame Companion of the New Zealand Order of Merit for her services to women and economics. She is also a Zonta International Honorary Member.





Marilyn met with Lynne Foley OAM, host of the Remarkable Women, Powerful Stories podcast, to discuss her ongoing efforts to bring visibility and credibility to all forms of work done by women and her commitment to empowering women to become experts in their own livelihoods.

Ending Child Marriage Advocacy Webinar

Global actions have been taken over the last decade to end child marriage, but is estimated the world is at least another 300 years away from achieving this goal. When appropriate systems are implemented, access to education, health, protection and economic prosperity become possible for the most vulnerable girls.
