





WOMEN'S SAFEHOUSE SERVICE PROJECT

On April 1, club members Peggy Gilbertson, Laura Burton, Sharon Hales and Linda White plus two friends of Peggy's volunteered at the Women's Safe House. This organization provides emergency safe shelter, advocacy and support for women and children fleeing from domestic violence. We sorted donated clothing for their "boutique" that provides free clothing for the women and children who many times leave a situation with just the clothes they are wearing. We changed out winter clothing for spring/summer clothing and bagged up all of the clothing from winter that was donated but not used. They let us take those bags with us to donate to WAC pickups. We filled 4 large cars!







Our last service project will be on Thursday, May 8th at Rung for Women, located at 2717 Sidney Street, 63104. This is an amazing organization that helps women move up the career ladder. There is no cost for women who are typically unfulfilled, unhappy, and underpaid in their current jobs, but don't know how to take the next step to enhance their career. They work with employers who use geospatial technology to meet their workforce needs while seeking to increase the number of women, especially women of color, in geospatial careers.

The organization grows their own food that is used to make meals for the students (farm to table) and they also provide a free farmers market for the women so they can make healthy meals at home. As volunteers, we can do anything from harvesting the produce, weeding, composting, planting and cutting or preparing seed packets. We can finetune the project as to what we prefer. For example, last year a few sat the whole time and prepared seed packets and sifted dirt to collect worms while others weeded.
